**Program Tonight: Dean of UCCS School of Business, Dr. Vincat Reddy, gave us a talk and slide presentation on the progress of UCCS and Business School since its inception in 1965.**

- UCCS has grown massively since being founded as one of 4 University of Colorado campuses in 1965. There are now 1 in Boulder and 2 in Denver. UCCS is slated for a lot more growth, mainly because it is the only one with lots of land to expand. Now over 12,000 students and could eventually be as much as 50,000 in the medium future.
- The School of Business has a very large on-line MBA program, with over 200 students—about the same number as on-campus MBA program. They even have 4 Phd. Degrees that can be obtained.
- Dr. Reddy showed some of the physical plant changes and upgrades to the B-school and it is now well positioned to serve the needs of our community, driven by many of the regions larger employers.
- Of interest to the club, especially, was the existence of a Golf Course Management curriculum and degree as a separate discipline in the business school. When we found out they have a computerized “swing lab,” many of the Kiwanians offered (begged) to come up for a tour and try it out. Dr. Reddy would be pleased to give us a personal tour, should we truly want to come up there and see for ourselves.
