**Program Tonight: Lee Newman, on Home Fire Safety!**

- Home fires are the #1 in-home killer, and those 5 years old and younger are 2X as likely to perish as others in the home. Even if you survive, being a burn victim is a horrible experience at best.
- 4 Main Misconceptions: 1) It won't happen to me! 2) I'll have plenty of time to escape. 3) Only large fires kill, not small ones. 4) My smoke alarm will save me.
- Most home extinguishers are plastic and smoke alarms the cheap ionization kind. Neither are reliable and have a 55% failure rate. Get the metal ABC extinguishers and keep one in kitchen and one in master bedroom just in case. Also, keep a "fire bat" handy to bash out windows in an emergency.
- Don't go to bed with clothes dryer going—lint/dryer fires are very common.
- All fires produce Carbon Monoxide, so be prepared for that also, with quality CO alarms and correct placement.
- Better to be safe by buying the better "master optic" technology smoke alarms as well as heat activated wind-up alarms that are not battery dependent. It is also wise to use fire consultant like Lee as the construction of home will dictate the number, type and placement of smoke, heat, and Carbon Monoxide detectors.
