Kiwanis International announced the new worldwide service project at the recent International Convention in Las Vegas. The project is "**Maternal and Neonatal Tetanus (MNT)**". Forty (40) countries are involved with 129 million mothers at risk. When a baby is born and is infected with tetanus because the mother was not vaccinated, seizures occur, leading to death by the 7th day of life. This is an ancient disease referred to in the Bible. Kiwanis International has coupled with UNICEF as a partnership to help eliminate this dreaded disease. It is intended to provide vaccines at a cost of sixty cents (\$0.60) each. Education and outreach to remote areas will be necessary.
