## TODAY'S MEETING

## 2010 State of the City – Warsaw, Indiana

Tim Meyer introduced Mayor Wiggins a graduate of Purdue University with a degree in economics. He has been a Licensed Certified Public Accountant since 1980, a Warsaw business owner and partner of Ramsey & Wiggins, Inc. Wiggins serves as chairman of the Audit Committee of the Indiana Association of Cities and Towns, and is a member of both their Legislative and Executive Committees. As a member of the Homeland Security and Emergency Management Team, Mayor Wiggins works with other area Mayors on regional emergency preparedness.

Mayor Wiggins address the following topics as part of his 2010 State of the City presentation:

- **Warsaw Airport:** Last year was the first time that fuel sales did not cover the operational cost of the airport. The Warsaw Municipal Airport expansion will need to arrange to have the power lines east of the airport moved before any additional expansion planning is completed.
- **Park Department:** The city received \$200,000 in private/public support last year for parks and recreation facilities. This year's Center Lake Park annual free Concert Series is planned.
- **Fire Territory:** Warsaw contractually provides fire protection for Wayne Township. The establishment of the Fire Territory was to spread the cost of fire protection services over whoever is receiving the service. Wiggins noted that Winona Lake elected not to participate and will provide fire protection based on their volunteer Fire Department.
- **Waste Water:** The infrastructure needed for the community to grow has resulted in the implementation of the Warsaw Master Plan Sewer expansion, and the building of a second waste water treatment plant. Indiana American Water Company has addressed a plan on how to deliver residents with improved water quality.
- **Public Works:** The project to eliminate a stoplight and make the intersection at Center St. more of an S curve is complete. Parker Street from Center Street out to U.S. 30 will be completed with sidewalks and street lights when weather permits.  
Center Street sidewalk/curb improvements were required to meet federal handicapped requirements.  
Market Street reconstructed included a combined sewer overflow, now the street is scheduled to be resurfaced and possible extension of the county Bike Path.
- **Miscellaneous:** Elaine Call has served as Warsaw's clerk-treasurer for the past 25 years and has decided to resign. She will continue until March 5 and complete the year-end and annual reports.

Wiggins who has been Mayor of the City of Warsaw since March 1, 1997, noted that he does not plan to pursue another term in office.

Martin Supermarket would like to be open by November 1, 2010.

There is a meeting planned for 7:00 p.m. on February 2, 2010 at the Police Department to discuss making Dubois Drive a one-way street.

Mayor Wiggins fielded questions from members before ending the meeting.
