Trivia

Magical Art

Magic is a performing art that entertains an audience by creating illusions of seemingly impossible or supernatural feats, using purely natural means. These feats are called magic tricks, effects or illusions. Some performers may also be referred to by names reflecting the type of magical effects they present, such as prestidigitators, conjurers, mentalists, or escape artists.

Jean-Eugène Robert-Houdin, known as "The Father of Modern Magic," performed throughout Europe in the 1840s and 50s. He was one of the first magicians to perform for the public in theaters, as opposed to at country fairs, on street corners or in the marketplace.

Jean-Eugène Robert-Houdin was a great magician and an inventor who studied science and used the cutting-edge technologies of his day in his shows. One of the most famous magicians who ever lived read about Robert-Houdin and wanted to be like him. That's why a boy named Erich Weiss chose the name Harry Houdini.

Harry Houdini is the most famous magician in history. He was born Erik Weisz on March 24, 1874, in Budapest, Hungary - and 4 years old when his family emigrated to America. His worldwide fame came from making amazing escapes. Early routines included getting out of straitjackets and handcuffs. He eventually performed an act where he was shackled with irons, placed in a box that was locked, roped, and weighted - and then submerged under water. Abracadabra!

Legendary magician Harry Houdini died in Detroit of gangrene and peritonitis resulting from a ruptured appendix on Halloween in 1926. He and his wife, Bess, had devised a secret code to use to test messages from the spirit world after one of them died. Bess attended seances trying to contact Houdini for several years waiting to hear... "Rosabelle- answer- tell- pray, answer- look- tell- answer, answer- tell". The Houdinis' secret phrase spelled out the word "BELIEVE" Seances are still held to contact Houdini. None have been successful.

Magic today is way different than hundreds of years ago. Some people still believe in witchcraft or still read their horoscope in the daily newspaper, but we mostly use it as entertainment. It is also with us in superstitions, such as a lucky penny or a rabbit's foot.
