3. Noting the presentation of the Gerald P. Christiano Distinguished Service Award, bestowed by the Past Governor's Council, on Edward Sexton. Sexton, active in Key Club for 26 years, has been a District Foundation Board Member for 19 years.
4. Thanking International Trustee Jim Jennings, who is the counselor to the New York District this year, for his assistance to the district.
5. Noting the election of Thomas DeJulio as vice-president of Kiwanis International for the coming year, thanking him for his leadership and commitment to Kiwanis, and endorsing his uncontested election as Kiwanis International President-Elect at the 2011 Kiwanis International Convention, and as President of Kiwanis International at the 2012 Kiwanis International Convention.
