The Kiwanis family tree is like a ladder which can be joined at any rung. It begins with elementary school students: Kiwanis Kids which provides three programs- K-Kids, Terrific Kids and Bring Up Grades- for students ages 6 to 12.

In each, children learn to plan, set goals, work with others and celebrate successes.

For teens there are: Builders Club, which is exclusively for middle and junior high students; Key Club, which is the largest high school service club in the world; and Key Leader, a weekend leadership experience for students age 14-18.

For young adults there is: Circle K International, which is the premiere university and college service organization in the world, with clubs on more than 500 campuses in 17 nations.

In Europe, there is Kiwanis Junior Club, which shares the Kiwanis service experience with younger adults, ages 18-35. This became an official program in 1992 and now includes more than 50 clubs.

For adults living with disabilities there is the Aktion Club. There are more than 200 clubs in seven nations, developing initiative and leadership skills through hands-on service. These adults return to
