Chuck Jackson, from the Newark Parks and Recreation Department, spoke about three important upcoming community events. First, and of greatest interest and importance to our club, preparation for the June 4-6 *Newark Strawberry Festival* is moving smoothly. Arrangements for sponsors, vendors and entertainers are on target. According to Chuck, the increase in attendance was due to great weather and increased efforts to market the Festival as a tourist attraction. Chuck next talked about a new event to be conducted by the Newark Parks & Recreation Department and Downtown Newark Association. "*Party on the Roof*," with an Hawaiian theme, will be held on June 18 in the evening at the Licking County parking garage. Lastly he talked about a "*Music & Wings Festival*" to be held on the Square on August 13-14.

It is the month that fellow Kiwanian **Heather Odendahl** puts on her day-job hat as Public Relations Manager for the Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities to remind us of the many valuable services they provide. Today, she shared with us a powerful video about a family raising a child with Down's Syndrome. The Team "Up" video personifies what it is like to have a child with developmental disabilities. It also showed what these proud parents did that brought happiness to them, their son and many other families with developmentally disabled children. This emotionally packed video (developed by Sports Time, Ohio) won a state-wide award for in-depth reporting. It needs to be viewed more than once to be fully appreciated. Here are Heather's personal comments about the video: ["The family featured is the Wollenberg family. Jay \(dad\) is a native of Newark who played minor league ball. His wife, Michelle, is from Pennsylvania. They moved back here to Newark shortly after Justice was born so that they could get early intervention services for him here at the E.S. Weiant Center \(as mentioned in the video\). Jay has coached at Newark High School but I'm not sure if he is currently coaching. He also does private training and baseball camps at The Advantage Club. There are literally dozens of volunteers who make Team 'Up' possible. This is just an excellent example of how a grassroots effort makes a big difference in the lives of kids with developmental disabilities. I spend a lot of time going out to groups discussing county board issues and acceptance of people with developmental disabilities, but nothing can compare to the impact this video makes. I'm glad I could share it with our fellow Kiwanians today."](#)
