The list of service activities that their 75 member club has provided this year alone is truly impressive. Club president, Kalleen, discussed the full page list that was distributed Anna. Of course, we know that they help us with the Strawberry Festival and Pancake Day. Bur most of us were not aware of all the other great things they do to help our community. Their Thanksgiving drive

produced over 3000 food pantry items , 20 baskets of 'love' and 40 blankets for families in need. They provided two complete Thanksgiving dinners for needy families and raised \$115 for UNICEF. The club sold T-shirts (designed by **Kelleen**) to help support a cancer patient and provided a breakfast for faculty. They raised \$200 for Catholic Relief Services for Haiti and Chile. The list of activities for the rest of the year is just as impressive. The Key Club members demonstrate great character and leadership as they provide services for our community.

## 20th Century Club Enriching the Lives of Licking County Children

Every Newark Kiwanian knows that 20th Century Club members are always ready to help raise money for Camp O'Bannon — and they have since 1926. In that year, our clubs joined together for operation of the Baby Vacation Camp that ultimately became Camp O'Bannon. But most of us did not know much about the 20th Century Club until Doris Spriggs talked to us. With her bubbly personality and great sense of humor, Doris led us through the history of the 20th Century Club that is often intertwined with our club's history.









As the name implies, their club was born early in the 20th Century. The original members, ten girls ages 10 to 13, first met in 1913. Club dues were 10 cents a month. In the early years, the club raised money primarily for the Newark Hospital (LMH today). In 1926, the Newark

Kiwanis and Phi Sigma Chi Fraternity joined with 20th Century as sponsor and supporters of the fresh air camp that became Camp O'Bannon.

In 1937, 20th Century Club conducted the first Flyer — which has been held nearly every 2 years since. Over the years, they have raised funds for many organizations, but Camp O'Bannon has become their major focus. This year's Flyer "TUNE IN" is being directed by Matthew Trombetta, Artistic Director for the Weathervane Playhouse. It is about TV shows from the 50s—80s. These are shows that we all enjoyed and remember well. Doris is one of the chairs of this year's production. Buy your tickets now to see the Flyer production on April 16 or 17 at the Newark High School .











































**Note of Interest:**
