Holy Week Service at St Paul's Lutheran Church March 29, 2010



As our club has done for several years, it began Holy Week by attending the Community Holy Week Service at St Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church. The Gothic architecture and stained glass windows of this 126 year-old church is a beautiful spiritual setting. The annual community service is sponsored by the Newark Area Ministerial Association.

A beautiful organ prelude was provided by church organist, Ruth Watson. The Rev. Bill Rauch, Pastor at St Paul's (and fellow Kiwanian), opened the service. The sermon was delivered by the Rev. Rich Clark (another fellow Kiwanian). Rev Clark is a retired UMC minister who served as Chaplain at Licking Memorial Hospital for many years.

The service offering will help support the Licking County Jail Ministry, a project started by the Ministerial Association 21 years ago. It has remained an effective and important ministry to those incarcerated. The only support for this ministry comes from the local religious community.

Note of Interest: This year marks the 7th year in the revival of an old Newark tradition of having a community sunrise service in the Midland Theater. The service begins at 6:30 am on Easter morning. It is sponsored by the Ministerial Association.

- Newark Kiwanis conducts many activities throughout the year for the community which raises money to support Camp O'Bannon, the summer baseball and softball leagues and other services for children.

These activities include:

- The Annual Newark Strawberry Festival: three days of summer fun, entertainment, good food and delicious strawberry shortcake on the Courthouse Square.
- The Annual Pancake Day: all the pancakes and sausage you can eat plus great entertainment and a bake sale of homemade goodies.
- The Annual Fish Fry at Camp O'Bannon: your chance to visit the camp, visit with friends, eat fish and chicken right off the grill and fill up at a great buffet.
