VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Jo Fedor from the Licking County United Way met with us to recruit volunteers to help with the *16th Annual Day of Caring*. Each year, United Way brings together hundreds of volunteers to work on community projects of all types.

This year's *Day of Caring* will be on Friday, June 18th. Volunteers will meet at specific sites at 12:00 noon: the Rotary Park in Newark, Ye Olde Mill (home of Velvet Ice Cream) in Utica, the boat ramp off of 79 at Buckeye Lake and a site to be determined in Pataskala. Volunteers

will eat together at their respective sites and be assigned to projects for the afternoon's work (going until 5:00). Projects vary each year depending upon the event sponsors. Last year there were 24 event sponsors and about 350 volunteers. Volunteers helped pull weeds, clean trails, wash windows, build Habitat houses or other work chosen by the sponsors. Previous volunteers have said that this gave them a first-hand look at services offered in the community, hands-on experience and a great opportunity for team building.

You can complete the Community Volunteer Registration form that Jo distributed and return it to United Way by May 7. According to United Way, the Day of Caring is a great way for "making connections, building lasting relationships, and creating a better place to live." 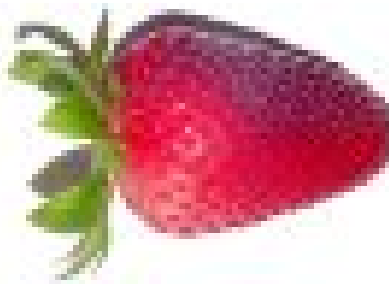
How do I sign up online to help with the Strawberry Festival?
