### **Activities and Services of the Muscular Dystrophy Association of Central Ohio**



The passion of **Amie Jones** for her work with the Muscular Dystrophy Association, MDA, was evident as she talked with us about MDA activities and services in Southeastern Ohio. Most of us know about MDA because of the annual MDA Labor Day telethon for "Helping Jerry's Kids" which is hosted by comedian Jerry Lewis. But many of us did not realize that there are nine different types of muscular dystrophy. The most common type, Duchenne muscular dystrophy, affects only boys. Nor did we know that MDA helps people who are afflicted with any one of 43 neuromuscular diseases. The most common of these is ALS (Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis), better known as Lou Gehrig's Disease.

MDA has two area clinics providing care and conducting research. Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus focuses on gene therapy of Duchenne muscular dystrophy. The Ohio State University Medical Center is a site for MDA ALS research and clinical care. Both sites have teams of neurologists, other medical specialists, and therapists. MDA staff work closely with these teams to help patients with their home and family life. Individual education plans are developed to help children and their classmates understand and cope with the progressing muscle weakness and use of various braces and support devices.

Amie told us about "Loan Closets" that have been developed to serve the over 1300 individuals who have registered with, and receive help from, the local MDA. MDA Loan Closets provide various types of medical equipment at no cost to registered individuals. Local MDA Loan Closets are located in Wheeling, Zanesville and Columbus.

Amie spoke very highly of MDA Summer Camp which is designed for children with Muscular Dystrophy and other neuromuscular diseases. The central Ohio camp is at Recreation Unlimited in Ashley. It is designed for the disabled. According to Amie, campers say the week at camp is "the best week of the year." MDA camp is a place where year-round skills are developed, friendships are formed, and where a kid with a disability can just have fun.

## Members to Vote on Meeting Location and Caterer

At their 7/12 meeting, the Board of Directors explored options for handling the recent increases in costs for meeting space rental and catering service. Their recommendations will be presented to club members for discussion and approval soon. The Board's goals are (1) to find the best location and catering service that can be handled within the existing administrative budget, and (2) to keep membership dues stable.

### Background:

The Licking County Historical Society (LCHS), which owns and manages the Buckingham House, recently selected a different catering service, Doug's Far Side Catering, to be the exclusive caterer for all meal functions held at the Buckingham House. LCHS also proposed increasing rental charges. Michael Harris talked extensively with several organizations to find an acceptable alternative at a reasonable cost. The Board considered all of the options.

### Recommendations:

The Board's recommendations will be presented at a regular Club meeting for discussion and action. Other options may be presented from the floor. Dave Whiteman will provide more detailed information by email prior to the meeting.

## Notes from the Board Meeting.

- Almost all of the income and expenses for the Strawberry Festival are known. It looks like we will net a little over \$19,000 this year. While this is less than last year, given the bad weather, it is a good return
- The Cub will make a \$50 donation to Hospice in memory of Ivan Mathis.
- Our Club will send three or four delegates to this year's District Convention.
