Gary sent a note to update everyone on their club's "PROJECT SIPALAY" which is making a difference in the lives of malnourished children in Sipalay Philippines. The Menchville High School Key Club received great support last year from The Hilton Village Kiwanis, The Warwick Kiwanis and the Warwick High School Key Club. Gary, his wife, Susie and their children, Shannon and Seth rented their home in Hilton and embarked on a journey near and dear to their hearts. They are presently living in a little town, Bacolod, Negros, Occidental, Philippines where they will live for the next 12 months. One exciting part of this for them is the little town of Bacolod is just 3 hours drive to Sipalay where their club members partnered with Sipalay high school students last year to administer "Project Sipalay". A food distribution and medical mission program.
