Ten things you can do around the home to help reduce your carbon footprint:

1. Replace inefficient incandescent light bulbs with energy star bulbs-reduce your carbon footprint by 450 pounds a year.
2. Keep your tires properly inflated and get better gas mileage – reduce your carbon footprint another 20 pounds for each gallon of gas saved.
3. Change your car's air filter regularly.
4. Plant a tree because trees suck up carbon dioxide and make clean air for us to breathe.
5. Run your dishwasher only when it's full.
6. Move your heater thermostat down two degrees in winter and up two degrees in the summer - reduce your carbon footprint by 2000 pounds.
7. Use a low-flow showerhead because the less water you use, the less energy required heating the water - reduces your carbon footprint 350 pounds a year.
8. Buy locally and reduce the amount of energy required to drive your products to your store.
9. Buy products with less packaging and recycle paper, plastic and glass-reduce your garbage by 10% and you'll reduce your carbon footprint by 1,200 pounds.
10. Keep your water heater insulated and the thermostat no higher than 120F
