Board of Directors

Meeting: The meeting was convened at 7:00 a.m., May 26th at Be's restaurant. With a quorum present, a motion to approve the minutes for April 28th was seconded and carried.

Financial Reports: 21st Century

Account: As of the above date, the consolidated balance for this account is \$14,214. This amount includes \$8,675 in the checking account and \$5,539 in the savings account. Activity included income of \$1,252 and expenses of \$1,264. Income includes \$1,157 from the Poker Rally, \$95 from the Farmers market, and \$.46 interest. The expenses include \$794 for the poker run (\$300. for t-shirts, \$284 for food and supplies, and \$210 for the Port A Potty), \$15 for books for Page Ahead, \$12 in Farmers Market supplies, \$130 for Key Club officer pins, \$263 for Key Club Graduation Stolls, and \$50 for a savings bond for Eagle Scout Sam G. Upcoming expenses and pending activity include reimbursement from WSHS for \$280, the student's portion of the DCON registration fee. We anticipate upcoming expenses for supplies for the Farmers Market, as well as a \$50 savings bond for Ryan Jacobs' Eagle Court of Honor. **Project Account:** Currently, as of the above date, the consolidated balance for this account is \$4,598. This amount reflects \$685 in checking and \$3,918 in savings. On May 19th, the CD matured and \$3,549.44 rolled into the savings account. During the period the CD was active, the club earned \$49 in interest from the CD. During the same period, interest earned on the regular savings account was under \$2. Combined available funds are \$4,603. There was no other activity in the Project Account this period. Anticipated expenses for the next period will be from the Governor's Project, Westcrest Off-Leash Park. **Administrative Account:** As of the above date, the consolidated balance for the Administrative account is \$1,382. This amount reflects \$742 in checking and \$639 in savings. Please note, during this period our annual membership dues check to Kiwanis International, in the amount of \$2,210, was submitted and processed. The typical transactions were the collection of breakfast & other revenues which were primarily offset by payments issued to Be's Restaurant. On May 8th, the club participated in the Community Garage sale and raised over \$318 for the Administrative account. There was no other significant activity for this account during the recent period. **Unbudgeted Expenditures:** There were no unbudgeted bills presented. *A motion to accept all of the financial reports was seconded and carried.*

Fundraising Committee: Kiwanis Motorcycle & Classic Car Poker Run: As noted above, this activity grossed approximately \$1,160; gross receipts are approximately \$360 (We Need Members To Buy Tee Shirts!). Also, the board approved giving both Eagle Leather and Eastside Harley the window slickers and accoutrements that go with them. Warren created great certificates of appreciation for our sponsors and the Undead Car Club. 64th Annual Pancake Breakfast: The board empowered Charlie Runke to open a conversation with the Masonic hall regarding extra space to offer a Bizarre Sale. Garage Sale: this event raised \$318 for the Administrative account.
