Board of Directors Meeting: The meeting was convened at 7:00 a.m., June 23rd at Be's restaurant. With a quorum present, a motion to approve the minutes for May 26th was seconded and carried.

Financial Reports: 21st Century Account: As of the above date, the consolidated balance for this account is \$12, 906. This includes \$7,367 in the

checking account and \$5,539 in the savings account. During the current period, activity included income of \$340 and expenses of \$1,648. Income includes \$280 reimbursement from WHSH for the Key Club dues, \$20 from the sale of t-shirts, and \$40 from the Farmers market. The expenses include \$53 for the Seattle Lutheran Bible, \$1,500 for Crew 284's upcoming outing, \$45 for a thank you gift for Cynthia Niver, and \$50 for a savings bond for Eagle Scout Ryan J. Upcoming Expenses and Pending activity: we anticipate upcoming expenses for supplies for the Pirates Landing in July, Westside Baby Stuff the Bus, as well as supplies for the Farmers Market.

Project Account: As of the above date, the consolidated balance for this account is \$4,349. This amount reflects \$429 in checking and \$3,920 in savings. Interest earned for June totaled \$1.50.

Expenses were: \$100 to the Senior Center of West Seattle; \$55.98 reimbursement to West Niver for the Westcrest Off Leash Park (Governors' Project); and, \$100 reimbursement to West Niver for our club's donation to the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life event. **Administrative Account:** As of the above date, the consolidated balance for the Administrative account is \$1,422. This amount reflects \$782 in checking and \$640 in savings. The typical transactions were the collection of breakfast & other revenues which were primarily offset by payments issued to Be's Restaurant. \$70 was paid to the City of Seattle Parks Dept to reserve Shelter #4 for our June 30th 5th Wednesday Summer Potluck.

Unbudgeted Expenditures: The board approved the purchase of five more window decals for a total of \$100 (from the Project account). *A motion to accept all of the financial reports was seconded and carried.*

Committee Issues:

Fundraising Committee: 64th Annual Pancake Breakfast: Charlie Runke reported that the Masonic Hall is open to using upstairs as space for the Bizarre Sale, providing there is enough room. Fall Wine Tasting: The board approved exploring a wine tasting fundraiser for the 21st Century Scholarship fund during the fall of 2010; details and recommendations to follow.

Administrative/Executive Committee: Officers Elections: Elections for the following positions will be held at the 5th Wednesday Social Potluck; West Niver for President and Denis Sapiro for Vice President. We are still in need of a President Elect and a Newsletter Editor for the upcoming K-Year. Installation Dinner: The 2010-11 Installation of Officer's dinner is scheduled for 6:30 p.m., Wednesday, Sept. 29 at the Duwamish Tribal Longhouse on West Marginal Way S.W. Same Location as last year's Attending the KI Convention are: Mike LaFranchi, Denis Sapiro, Karl Sutter, Henry Nelson, Joel Draper, and West Niver. Club Accident Insurance: The board agreed that a presentation needed to be held before we could consider this insurance. KI Convention Elections: The board instructed the delegates to the KI convention to vote in the best interest of the club. The delegates should meet prior to the elections to confer on voting options.



Membership, Club Education, & Public Relations: Warren Lawless provided information to Shari Sewell (member of the PR committee) regarding the local Pole Banner program. 5th Wednesday Picnic-Social: plans are firm for the event to take place Wednesday, June 30 at Lincoln Park. 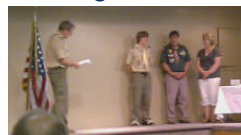
