**Board of Directors Meeting:** The meeting was convened at 7:00 a.m., August 25<sup>th</sup> at Be's restaurant. While a quorum was present, minutes for the last Board Meeting was not present to approve. That vote will occur at the next available meeting.

**Financial Reports: 21st Century Account:** Expenses were for the Project Cool activity (approx. \$300). Offsetting revenue was from interest and donations at the Farmers Market. **Project Account:** As of the above date, the consolidated balance for this account is \$4,043. During this period, there were no expenses. Interest received was \$1.34.. **Administrative Account:** As of the above date, the consolidated balance for the Administrative account is \$375.

The typical transactions were the collection of breakfast & other revenues which were primarily offset by payments issued to Be's Restaurant. Other activity included partial reimbursements to delegates attending the PNW Conference in Spokane. Please note, there are deposits pending from the last two meetings.

**Unbudgeted Expenditures:** The board approved reimbursing Shari Sewell for \$80 for the Recruitment postcards. A motion to accept all of the financial reports was seconded and carried.

### Committee Issues:

**Fundraising Committee:** 64<sup>th</sup> Annual Pancake Breakfast: This event is only three months and a week away. Fall Wine Tasting: This event will need to occur in October. June C. has done research with the local shops and learned of discounts they would provide. Mike L. will provide the contact name for the folks at So Sea Comm. College for info on holding it there; should it come to pass that we do this event.

**Administrative/Executive Committee:** Member Dues: At this time, the dues for the upcoming Kiwanis year are anticipated to be \$130. We will know more following this week's PNW Convention. Installation Dinner: A committee met with Dan Shames regarding his talents to be our caterer. They were impressed. Pres. West Niver discussed the menu with former member and Past Lt Gov, Dan Shames.
