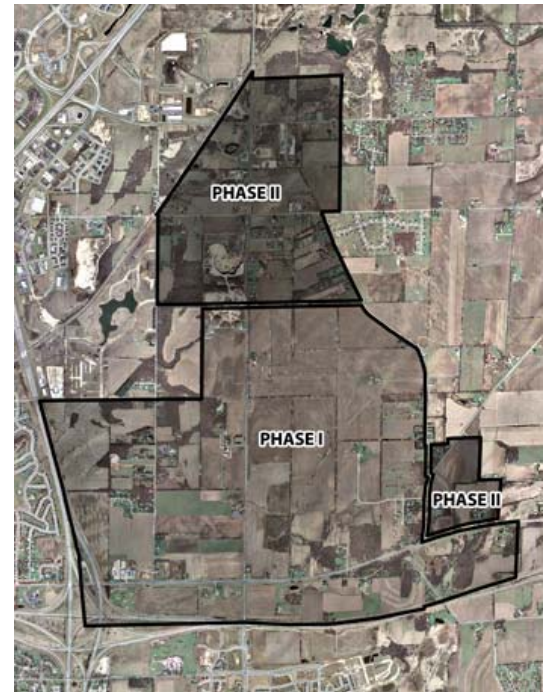

Program Notes for March 1st, 2010

Rick Roll of the City of Madison Planning Department presented and discussed the North East Development plan for the City of Madison and the towns of Blooming Grove and Burke. In 1990 the peripheral area development plan was developed. This plan was updated in 2006 along with the development of a comprehensive plan for the area. A plan for sustainability goals for the area was completed in March of 2009. A neighborhood development plan was completed in October of 2009. Many intergovernmental agreements have been reached between the city of Madison, the towns of Blooming Grove and Burke along with the Sun Prairie School District relative to the proposed or actual development in the area bordered by Route 51, Sprecher Road, and Routes 151 and 30. Mr. Roll illustrated his presentation with several maps and graphs. Mr. Roll answered questions regarding retail development in the area, affordability of the proposed housing, Interstate 90-94 accessibility, transportation including rapid rail and commuter rail, and projections of population and demand for development. Mr. Roll was introduced by Greg McManners.
